On June 5, 2015, the Commission issued its decision in this matter.¹ On June 17, 2015, the employer filed a motion for reconsideration and a stay of the effectiveness of the Commission's Order. On June 26, 2015, the Executive Director granted the union until July 17, 2015, to file a response. On July 17, 2015, the union filed a response. The Commission denies the motion as untimely.

The Administrative Procedure Act sets forth the timeframes for petitioning an agency for reconsideration or a stay of its final order. RCW 34.05.467 and .470. Both a petition for a stay and reconsideration must be filed within ten days of the service of the agency's final order. RCW 34.05.467 and .470(1). Service "means posting in the United States mail" RCW 34.05.010(19). Service is complete when the agency mails the decision to the parties. City of Seattle v. Public Employment Relations Commission, 116 Wn.2d 923, 927 (1991).

The Commission issued Washington State Ferries (Inlandboatmen's Union of the Pacific), Decision 12134-A (MRNE, 2015) on June 5, 2015. The Record of Service for the Commission states that the Commission's decision was deposited in the United States mail on June 5, 2015. Under the Commission's computation of time rule, the beginning of the ten-day period in which to file a motion for reconsideration or stay began the next day, June 6, 2015. WAC 391-08-100. A timely motion for reconsideration may have been filed no later than the close of business on June 15, 2015.

The employer filed its motion for reconsideration and a stay of effectiveness electronically at 5:10 p.m. on June 16, 2015. The motion was not timely filed and is therefore denied. *See Snohomish County PUD*, Decision 7656-B (PECB, 2003).

NOW, THEREFORE, it is

<u>ORDERED</u>

The motion for reconsideration is denied. The Order issued by Examiner Erin Slone-Gomez is affirmed.
