1. 3. These representation proceedings were conducted by the Commission in the bargaining unit described as:

All full-time and regular part-time secretarial and clerical employees of the district, excluding supervisors, voucher clerk, payroll clerk, and secretary to the superintendent.

4. All proceedings were conducted under the supervision of the Commission in a manner designed to afford the affected employees a free choice in the selection of their bargaining representative, if any; a tally of the results was previously furnished to the parties and is attached hereto; and no meritorious objections have been filed with respect to these proceedings.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The unit described in finding of fact number 3 is an appropriate unit for the purposes of collective bargaining within the meaning of RCW <u>41.56.060</u>; and all conditions precedent to a certification have been met.
