FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. The above-named Petitioner timely filed with the Public Employment Relations Commission a petition for investigation of a question concerning representation of employees of the above-named employer; said petition was accompanied by a showing of interest which was administratively determined by the Commission to be sufficient; and the employer declined voluntarily to extend recognition to the Petitioner as the exclusive bargaining representataive of its employees.
- 2. These representation proceedings were conducted by the Commission in the bargaining unit described as:

All full-time and regular part-time court clerks and clerical employees of the Snohomish County District Courts, excluding court administrators, administrative assistants, bailiffs,, probation counsellors, supervisors, confidential employees and all other employees of the employer.

3. All proceedings were conducted under the supervision of the Commission in a manner designed to afford the affected employees a free choice in the selection of their bargaining representative, if any; a tally of the results was previously furnished to the parties and is attached hereto; and no meritorious objections have been filed with respect to these proceedings.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

The unit described in Finding of Fact 2 is an appropriate unit for the purposes of collective bargaining within the meaning of RCW 41.56; and all conditions precedent to a certification have been met.
