On November 19, 1992, Anne Frederick submitted a number of documents to the Public Employment Relations Commission, together with an inquiry with respect to the procedures for filing a complaint with the Commission. The subject matter concerned Ms. Frederick's discharge from employment with the city of Everett on or about October 30, 1992. A file was opened under the case number indicated above,<sup>1</sup> and Ms. Frederick was supplied with the statute, rules and form applicable to processing of a complaint charging unfair labor practices under Chapter 41.56 RCW and Chapter 391-45 WAC. A 14-day period initially specified for a response was extended based on the telephonic request from Ms. Frederick, but nothing further has been received from Ms. Frederick.

The case is now before the Executive Director for a preliminary ruling pursuant to WAC 391-45-110.<sup>2</sup> The documents now on file are insufficient, under the requirements of WAC 391-45-050, to state a

claim for relief available through unfair labor practice proceedings before the Public Employment Relations Commission.


NOW, THEREFORE, it is
